Author Guidelines

- 1. Articles are unpublished manuscripts. The manuscript is written in Indonesian or English is good and correct. The manuscript may be a literature review article, research, case report, or medical science freshener.
- 2. The manuscript is written in two spaces on A4 paper with an edge spacing of 2.5 cm, with a 10-font Garamond letter, a two-column two 10-20 page format.
- 3. Research articles containing Abstract, introduction (containing background, purpose, and literature review), research methods, research results, and bibliography.
- 4. The Literature Review article is a review of a magazine and / or book on advanced health and medical science, containing abstracts, introductions (containing background and purpose), discussion and conclusions. Case reports are articles about interesting and rare clinical cases that are important to publish, containing abstracts, introductions, case reports and discussions.
- 5. The bibliography is written according to Hardvard that is based on the alphabetical order of the author's name. The number of authors listed is not more than two, if more after the first name followed by "et al". Example: Multiple myeloma (MM) is a haematological neoplasm of plasma cells or myeloma. (Licthman, Beutler, 2003)

Journal

Writing in order of author's name, publishing year, title of writing, journal name, publishing volume, first and last page.

Examples: Bosman C, Fusili S, Bisceglia M, 1996, Oncocytin Non-Secretory Multiple Myeloma, Acta Haematol, 96, pp.50-56.

Book

Writing a book in the order of the author's name, year of publication, book title and edition, publisher, and publishing city.

Examples: Lictman MA, Beutler E, Kipps T, 2003, Williams manual of Hematology, 6 thedn, McGraw-Hill, USA.

• Chapter in the book

Writing chapters in a book with the order of names of authors, year of publication, chapter title, In: name of editor, title of book, edition, publisher, publishing city, and first and last page.

Example: Foerster J, Paraskevas F 1999 Multiple Myeloma, In: Lee GC, Foerster J, Lukens J (eds). Wintrob's Clinical Hematology, 10th edn, William & Wilkins, USA, pp.2631-2680.

• Thesis

Thesis writing with the author's name, year of writing, title, name of degree, institution name, and institution location.

Example: Exelby HRA, 1997, Aspect of Gold and Mineral Liberation, PhD thesis, University of Queenland Brisbane.
